What is it to be a Christian?

Views vary and there are many very clever and learned theologians out there to help, but they often differ leaving us lessor mortals still wondering. As one of those lessor mortals, this is just my view: To be a Christian is to follow Christ as best we can. More specifically, Jesus Christ.

What does Jesus require of us?

When asked by his disciples, Jesus replied:

11 Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.

12 I Love your neighbour as yourself.

13 All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.

How do we love God?

A good place to start is by listening to God and we thus move to 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'

What is love?

We are helped by that wonderful definition given by Paul in a letter to the Corinthians, beginning:

Love is patient, love is kind..."

Who is our neighbour?

Jesus answered this with the parable of the Good Samaritan. From that we learn our neighbours are not only those people who we like, are like us and of our heritage.

So what is it to be a Christian?

I suggest it is to walk through life acknowledging God and being kind to others. Nicely summarised by the prophet Micah in approximately 700 BC:

"""...what doth the Lord require of thee but to do justly and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?


